Where Do Creatures Sleep at Night?


- 1. What is your favorite creature in this book?

- 4. What are the risks of each animal's sleeping place? What are the rewards?
- 5. Which animal in this book sleeps most like a human? Which animal sleeps least like a human?

Where Do Ocean Creatures Sleep at Night?


- 1. Oceans cover a large portion of our planet. What part of the ocean does each creature in this book call home?






